



The Lord is My Rock and My Life

Psalm 46:1-5

- 1 God is our refuge and strength,
an ever-present help in trouble.
- 2 Therefore we will not fear, though the earth give way
and the mountains fall into the heart of the sea,
3 though its waters roar and foam
and the mountains quake with their surging.
- 4 There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God,
the holy place where the Most High dwells.
- 5 God is within her, she will not fall;
God will help her at break of day.

The Goal of the Project: Each student creates a rock that has patterns with color, dots, and lines, in response to Psalm 46 and 03/29/2020 Gospel reading of our Lord raising Lazarus from the dead.

Materials Needed:

- Found rocks (1"x1" to 3"x3") Maybe on a walk with the family on the prairie path.
- Found house (acrylic based) paint (white or neutral color)
- Drop clothe
- Sharpie Marker(s) Black, Purple, Blue, Green, Red, Yellow, and Orange (maybe more if you have them)
- Two cups (one for water and one for paint)
- Medium size brush

Summary: Take your rock and paint it with several coats, at least two, of the house paint. Once it is dry then taking your colored markers start in the center of the rock, create a circular pattern of dots and color working your way out from the center. As you switch from colors, dots, dashes, and various kinds of marks, think of how the Lord breaths Life into you. Your mind, and your imagination.
