Materials Needed: White thick Paper
Cup of Water

Watercolor
Tape (clear & or masking)

Brushes
Sharpie Marker (large/small)
Hairdryer

Summary: The Lord meets us where we are at and then turns our lives into something beautiful! Here is an exercise where you can see how you can take everyday materials and create beautiful abstract artwork.

Directions:

Have watercolor paper and/or card stock paper in hand. Using masking and clear scotch tape with various lengths (small, medium, and large), tape down pieces in different directions (vertical, horizontal, and diagonal). Next, using warm colors, like yellow, orange, and red, distribute wet washes throughout the paper. Using a hairdryer, dry the paper until it is warm to the touch. Pull all the tape off slowly, then apply another amount of tape. Consider putting pieces perpendicular to the original pieces. Now apply the cool color wet washes like blue, green, and violet. Again, using a hairdryer, dry the paper until it is warm to the touch. Pull all the tape off slowly. Lastly, take thick and thin sharpie markers (black is a good start, but you can consider other colors) and outline the shapes that you see emerging from the paper.

Crystal Color Wheel

Red, yellow, and blue

Secondary colors
Orange, green, and violet
