

PASSOVER AND EXODUS

SCRIPTURE PASSAGE

Exodus 12-14

ACTIVITY

Create a door frame out of popsicle sticks, using glue or binder clips to hold them together. Paint the sides of the door frame with red acrylic paint as a reminder that Jesus died for us and saved us from our sins.

I WONDER:

- I wonder how many people still celebrate Passover today?
- I wonder what the pillar of cloud and the pillar of fire looked like?
- I wonder what would have happened if the ground had not been dry when God parted the Red Sea?

DIGGING DEEPER:

- Every week during the Eucharist, we say “Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us.” How does the Passover in Exodus point to Jesus? Here are some things that you can talk about:
 - Blood on the doorpost
 - Lamb without blemish
 - “You shall not break any of its bones” (See Exodus 12:46 and John 19:36)
- Whenever an animal is sacrificed in the Bible, it’s supposed to be without blemish or defect. Why do you think that is?
- How was passing through the Red Sea similar to baptism? How was it different?
- Exodus 14:31 says: Israel saw the great power that the LORD used against the Egyptians, so the people feared the LORD, and they believed in the LORD and in his servant Moses. Can you think of anything in your life that helped increase your trust in God?
