# GOOD FRIDAY

Good Friday is a solemn remembrance of Jesus' sacrifice of his own life so that we might find forgiveness and reconciliation with God. This is not a somber recapitulation of Jesus' death, but rather a thankful and reverently joyful recollection of his death that gave us life. This day and the next–Holy Saturday–are the only two days of the church calendar when there is no Eucharistic celebration. Traditionally, this service can be held at three o'clock in the afternoon or later to mark the hour of Jesus' death according to the Gospels.

It is believed that the liturgy for this service is derived from the earliest days of Christianity. The service begins in silence and with prayer. The clergy process in silently, dressed in black. Each year we hear the story of Christ's passion from the Gospel of John and have the opportunity to come forward and pray at the cross, remembering Christ's sacrifice for us.

# THE WORD OF GOD

Please observe silence at the beginning of the service. The procession enters in silence.

### The Entrance

On this day the ministers enter in silence. All then sit or kneel for silent prayer.

- OFFICIANT: All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way,
  - PEOPLE: and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all.
- OFFICIANT: Let us pray.

Almighty God, we beseech you graciously to behold this your family, for whom our Lord Jesus Christ was willing to be betrayed and given into the hands of sinners, and to suffer death upon the Cross; who now lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit; one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

### The Lessons

Please be seated for the reading.

**READER:** A reading from the prophet Isaiah.

#### Isaiah 52:13-53:12 (ESV)

- READER: The Word of the Lord.
- PEOPLE: Thanks be to God.

## The Solemn Collects

### The Confession of Sin

DEACON: Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

Please be seated or kneel. There will be a time of silence.

ALL: Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone.
We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves.
We are truly sorry and we humbly repent.
For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

**OFFICIANT:** Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. Amen.

## The Lord's Prayer

OFFICIANT: And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to pray,

ALL: Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy Kingdom come, thy will be done, On earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, And forgive us our trespasses, As we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, But deliver us from evil. Amen.
