# Easter Vigil: Easter Morning

The Great Vigil of Easter is a church treasure, passed down to us from the first generations of Christians. The Vigil tells the epic story of redemption in four services: the Service of Lessons, the Service of Light, the Service of Baptism, and the Service of Eucharist. We began yesterday with the Service of Light and Lessons, and this morning we conclude as we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. This morning's service includes:

#### The Easter Acclamation

The pinnacle of the Great Vigil of Easter takes place when the celebrant declares that Christ is risen. Church of the Resurrection has taken the ancient custom of ringing bells in celebration to new heights through the "Holy Noise," when the entire congregation makes a "joyful noise unto the Lord."

#### The Service of Baptism

In baptism, we live out the very realities we have seen in the readings. People in our midst cross over into the family of God through the waters of baptism, and we all renew our own baptismal covenant to be God's own.

#### The Service of Eucharist

In the final portion of the service, we receive the body and blood that Jesus offered up for us to be our life and food so that we can go forth and live as his people. It is the table of gathering in great thanksgiving for his death and life - now also our death to self and life in God. It is a time for great joy and celebration of God's saving work throughout history and within each of us.

As you enter into worship, we invite you to celebrate the miracle that, through Jesus' death and resurrection, God is restoring the beauty and goodness of the world he created. We pray that you would sense God's presence and invite him to bring that restoration to you.

## THE WORD OF GOD

In the first half of the service, we encounter God by hearing and responding to his truth in the Bible.



### The Exhortation

OFFICIANT: Dearly beloved, Scripture teaches that we were all dead in our sins and trespasses, but by grace we may be saved through faith. Our Savior Jesus Christ said, "Unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God"; and he commissioned the Church to "make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." Here we ask our heavenly Father that these Candidates, being baptized with water, may be filled with the Holy Spirit, born again, and received into the Church as living members of Christ's body. Therefore, I urge you to call upon God the Father, through our Lord Jesus Christ, that of his abundant mercy he will grant to these Candidates that which by nature they cannot have.

### The Presentation

OFFICIANT: The Candidates for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

Infants and young children are presented for baptism by their parents and godparents.

PARENTS: I/We present N. to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

OFFICIANT: Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is brought

up in the Christian faith and life?

PARENTS: I/We will, with God's help.

OFFICIANT: Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full

stature of Christ?

PARENTS: I/We will, with God's help.

OFFICIANT: Parents and godparents: today, on behalf of these children, you shall

make vows to renounce the devil and all his works, to trust God wholeheartedly, and to serve him faithfully. It is your task to see that these children are taught, as soon as they are able to learn, the meaning of all these vows, and of the Faith that you will profess as revealed in the Holy Scriptures. They must come to put their faith in Jesus Christ. When they have embraced him, they are to come to the Bishop to be confirmed, that they may publicly claim the Faith for their own and be further strengthened by the Holy Spirit to serve

Christ and his kingdom.

Older children and adults are presented for baptism by their parents, godparents,

and/or sponsors.

PRESENTERS: I/We present N. to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

OFFICIANT: Do you desire to be baptized?

CANDIDATE: I do.

### Profession of Faith

OFFICIANT: Do you renounce the devil and all the spiritual forces of wickedness

that rebel against God?

CANDIDATES: I renounce them.

OFFICIANT: Do you renounce the empty promises and deadly deceits of this world

that corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

CANDIDATES: I renounce them.

OFFICIANT: Do you renounce the sinful desires of the flesh that draw you from the

love of God?

CANDIDATES: I renounce them.

The Officiant prays over the Candidates while priests anoint each Candidate with

the Oil of Exorcism.

OFFICIANT: Almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness and evil, and

lead you into the light and obedience of the kingdom of his Son

Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

OFFICIANT: Do you turn to Jesus Christ and confess him as your Lord and Savior?

CANDIDATES: I do.

OFFICIANT: Do you joyfully receive the Christian Faith, as revealed in the Holy

Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments?

CANDIDATES: I do.

OFFICIANT: Will you obediently keep God's holy will and commandments, and walk

in them all the days of your life?

CANDIDATES: I will, the Lord being my helper.

The Officiant then addresses the Congregation. Please stand.

OFFICIANT: Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these

persons in their life in Christ?

PEOPLE: We will.

OFFICIANT: Let us join with these Candidates to proclaim our faith in the words of

the ancient baptismal confession, the Apostles' Creed. . .

**OFFICIANT:** Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

PEOPLE: I do.

I believe in God the Father almighty,

creator of heaven and earth.

OFFICIANT: Do you believe and trust in Jesus Christ?

PEOPLE: I do.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.

He was conceived by the Holy Spirit

and born of the Virgin Mary.
He suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven,

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

OFFICIANT: Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit?

PEOPLE: I do.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

OFFICIANT: Let us now pray for these Candidates who are to receive the

Sacrament of Baptism.

LEADER: That these children may come to confess their faith in Jesus Christ as

LEADER: That all these Candidates may continue in the apostles' teaching and

the fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers.

PEOPLE: We beseech you to hear us, Good Lord.

LEADER: That they may walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which they

have been called, ever growing in faith and all heavenly virtues.

PEOPLE: We beseech you to hear us, Good Lord.

LEADER: That they may persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever they fall into

sin, repent and return to the Lord.

PEOPLE: We beseech you to hear us, Good Lord.

LEADER: That they may proclaim by word and deed the Good News of God in

Christ Jesus to a lost and broken world.

PEOPLE: We beseech you to hear us, Good Lord.

LEADER: That as living members of the Body of Christ, they may grow up in

every way into him who is the head.

PEOPLE: We beseech you to hear us, Good Lord.

LEADER: That, looking to Jesus, they may run with endurance the race set

before them, and at the last receive the unfading crown of glory.

PEOPLE: We beseech you to hear us, Good Lord.

## Prayer for the Candidates

OFFICIANT: Let us pray.

Almighty and everlasting Father, in your great mercy you saved Noah and his family in the Ark from the destruction of the flood, prefiguring the Sacrament of Holy Baptism. Look mercifully upon these your servants. Wash and sanctify them through your Holy Spirit, that they may be delivered from destruction and received into the Ark of Christ's Church; and being steadfast in faith, joyful through hope, and rooted in love, they may pass through the turbulent floods of this troublesome world and come into the land of everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

ALL: Amen.

# Thanksgiving Over the Water

At this time, children may come forward to watch the baptisms.

OFFICIANT: The Lord be with you.

PEOPLE: And with your spirit.

OFFICIANT: Lift up your hearts.

PEOPLE: We lift them up to the Lord.

OFFICIANT: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

PEOPLE: It is right to give him thanks and praise.

Please be seated.

OFFICIANT: We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit

moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John in the River Jordan

when the Holy Spirit descended upon him as a dove.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are born again by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Now, Father, sanctify this water by the power of your Holy Spirit. May all who are baptized here be cleansed from sin, be born again, and continue for ever faithful in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever

ALL: Amen.

OFFICIANT: N., I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

N., you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever.

OFFICIANT: Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon these your servants the forgiveness of sin, received them as your own children by adoption, made them members of your holy Church, and raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit, that they may enjoy everlasting salvation through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

OFFICIANT: Saying together:

ALL: We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

OFFICIANT: Let us welcome the newly baptized.






